LABOUR AMENDMENT ACT

The Labour Amendment Bill was published in the Gazette on the 19th of November 2021 and it has finally been enacted into an Act. According to the Act, it attempts to bring conformity with the Constitution of Zimbabwe (section 24) and with various conventions drawn up by the International Labour Organisation (ILO). The Act attempts to streamline the resolution of Labour disputes and deal with issues such as Labour broking and workplace violence and harassment. The Act's memorandum states that it is a product of extensive consultation with representatives of Government, business and labour.

ZIMRA COMPLIENCE


The Zimbabwe Revenue Authority (ZIMRA) is highly encouraging taxpayers with outstanding returns to submit without further delay. Late submissions of returns and payment of tax attracts penalties, interest and prosecution respectively. Following the announcement by the Government of the Republic of Zimbabwe on promotion of the use of local currency in the country through payment of taxes in Zimbabwe dollars, the Zimbabwe Revenue Authority wishes to advice taxpayers that usual penalties for late submission and payment of tax are still applicable.

In an effort to reduce compliance costs and to enhance operational efficiency, the Zimbabwe Revenue Authority is set to introduce the fiscalisation Data Management Systems (FDMS). Which are aimed at eliminating the challenges being experienced by the current systems which include Non-standardation of fiscal devices that are being supplied by approved suppliers and system inaccessibility by all stakeholders.




2023 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING/CONGRESS



The big ticket infrastructure projects among others include Lake Gwayi-Shanyani, Harare- Beitbridge highway, Hwange units 7 and 8, the Beitbridge Border Post modernisation and the expansion of the Robert Mugabe International Airport among others.

Several multi- billion- dollar initiatives by the private sector such as the US\$ 1billion steel plant in Manhize and new lithium projects, Prospect Lithium Zimbabwe, Sabi Star Mine and Zulu Lithium are also expected to begin production.

The growth in infrastructure development in Zimbabwe sheds light for a better tomorrow and hope that more projects are on their way stimulates the construction industry at large.

Transport Infrastructure summit

ROBUST INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT IS AT THE HEART OF THE SECOND REPUBLIC'S ECONOMIC TRANSFORMATION AGENDA IN LINE WITH THE COUNTRY'S VISION TO ACHIEVE AN UPPER MIDDLE-INCOME STATUS BY 2030.

Running under the theme: "Accelerating Transport Infrastructure Development Projects in Zimbabwe: Towards World Class Transport Networks by 2030", the high-level infrastructure summit brought together private sector executives from different sectors, research institutions, and foreign delegates to deliberate on how the country could scale up infrastructure development projects, especially transport (road, rail and air) to enhance business efficiency and unlock wider and inclusive economic potential.

"The transformation and modernisation of the country's transport infrastructure would not be fully achieved through fiscal financing alone, but the private sector must come on board and commit more resources to supporting key projects for the greater good of the economy" President Dr Emmerson Dambudzo Mnangagwa

While the Government has led the way in setting the tone for modernising the economy and promulgating policies that enhance ease of doing business, he said more milestones could be achieved if private sector players — as primary beneficiaries of such projects — play a leading role in harnessing resources and assisting the country in tapping into latest development technologies.
